## DREAM WEAVER

As time marches on and the digital world gains a footbold on everyone and everything, items made by hand take on special signficance. With this in mind, Chilean native Catalina Marin launched Treko, a new line of luxury textiles handcrafted on Chiloé, an island in southern Chile. "Nowadays our traditions are getting lost," she says. "These techniques are passed from the grandmother, to the daughter and to the grandchildren, but these last ones have no motivation to continue them." The Sonoma-based entrepreneur is seeking to turn things around by working directly with local artisans to produce pillows, throws and more using techniques inherited from the 16th century and passed down through generations. "Our pillows and throws are the true expression of the culture and traditions of this southern part of Chile. Not only for the woven techniques, but also because of the dyeing process which [uses] natural ingredients such as bark, clay, leaves and flowers from Chiloé island." says Marin. Made of wool sheared from the Chilota sheep that are born and raised in the region, each unique item in the line is handmade by a master artisan. "The standout items are the throws, especially the Kuk line," she says. "They express the tradition of the island to bring luxury and coziness to a contemporary home." Looking ahead, Marin has big plans for Treko, ones that supercede textiles: "Our mission is to bridge and expose our culture to the world, creating progress and development in this remote and pristine Chilean location."
